What you do

You work with us at the base 3–4 days per week. The remaining days are yours to explore freely. You live in a guesthouse right next to our base. The village of Jambiani is very safe – you can move around freely, even in the evenings.

- Dive 3x per week and actively assist with coral and reef restoration
- Participate in community projects and scientific studies on the sexual reproduction of corals
- Sponge Farming Project: deploy sponges and liaise with local traders
- Optional: take over the social media account if you have content creation experience

Requirements

- **PADI Advanced** oder Open Water mit mindestens 15 nachgewiesenen Dives
- Minimum 3–4 days per week of active participation
- Enjoyment of working with corals underwater
- Interest in local culture and community engagement
- Openness to participating in small events and environmental education initiatives

What you will take away

- Genuine participation in a scientific and community-based marine conservation project
- Make a real impact, both locally and within the global scientific community
- Plenty of freedom to develop and lead your own environmental education initiatives
- Certificate of participation and a detailed reference letter outlining your individual responsibilities and contributions
- Valuable hands-on experience for your career at the heart of a small, family-like NGO
